All programs accredited by the Council on Social Work Education's Commission on Accreditation (COA) are required to measure and report student learning outcomes. All students are assessed using a minimum of two measures on their mastery of the nine competencies that comprise the Educational Policy and Accreditation Standards (EPAS) and any additional competencies programs may choose to add. These holistic competencies reflect the dimensions (knowledge, values, skills, and cognitive & affective processes) of social work practice that all social workers are expected to master during their professional training.

Methodology

The Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) asks that all accredited social work programs assess students across these specific competencies. Data collected from external field instructor evaluations served as a practice-based measure for assessing each competency, and at least one course-embedded measure was used to assess each competency. Data were collected at the practice behavior level using measurable objectives. A student's competency level for each measurable objective was assessed using a 5-point Likert scale, with 1 indicating little or no demonstration of competency, 2 indicating a beginning demonstration of competency, 3 indicating a sufficient demonstration of competency, 4 indicating a solid demonstration of competency, and 5 indicating an exemplary demonstration of competency. For measures that had multiple objectives for a given competency, an average was taken across the objectives for each student. Thereafter, students who scored a 3 or above were counted as having met the benchmark for that measure. Then the percentage of students who met the benchmark (3 or above) for the measure was calculated by taking the number of students who met the benchmark divided by the total number of students completing the outcome measure and multiplying this by 100. Our program aimed to have at least 80% of students at or above the benchmark of 3 or greater for each assessed competency.
